aims to significantly cut mission costs and risks by replacing the traditional "Battlestar Galactica" single spacecraft approach with lessons learned from multi-device networks such as the Internet.

Retired US General Wesley Clark, who is a member of the GeoOptics board, said in a recent interview that CICERO's design and funding attributes "could save \$1 billion and create several thousand jobs" as it tracks and delivers in real time highly accurate atmospheric data to government and commercial customers. If true, this bodes well for the emergence of other Space 2.0 ventures seeking to reach both traditional government customers and the far deeper pockets of the capital markets. <[more info](#)>
